Profile of the study program	<p>The study programme "Law and Penitentiary Activity" is a Bachelor programme, in which a total of 210 ECTS credits are granted based on the European Credit Transfer System. An ECTS credit point corresponds to an average workload of 26.6 hours. The study programme is designed as a full-time programme with an intended duration of seven semesters and a part-time programme with an intended duration of ten semesters. The total workload amounts to 5,600 hours. It is divided into 2,238 hours of study on site and 3,362 hours of independent study. The study programme is divided into modules. The study programme is completed with the higher education degree "Bachelor of Laws" (LL.B.). The minimum admission requirement for the study programme is the completion of secondary education. Higher education degrees are also taken into consideration and recognised during the admissions procedure. Students were first admitted to the programme in 1998. The programme Bachelor Studies in Law and Penitentiary Activities is also designed to train qualified and competitive law specialists for penitentiary and other law enforcement institutions. They shall acquire the skills required to perform in the modern European and global environment and develop professional skills in the sphere of law and penitentiary work.</p>
